Players are each given a lesson badge. However, in this version, players do NOT look at their badges.



One member of the group is assigned to be the "Shower." The shower presents their lesson badge and asks the group or partner, "What am !?"



Then, a new Shower is assigned and learners repeat step 4 until every shower has had a chance to guess their badge.

Instead, the card must be put on the player's body where they can not see it. Students are paired or put into small groups.





Each player takes a turn giving the Shower a clue. When the Shower guesses which badge they are wearing, they can remove their badge and hang it on an approved surface for everyone to see.
